The Merseyside School Games is delivered around five key principles:

Participation

To drive an increase in the number of young people accessing high quality school competition across Merseyside.

Inclusivity

To provide competitive school sport opportunities for all, including the less active.

Workforce

To enhance the pupil experience by broadening opportunities for participation through volunteering and leadership roles.

Performance

To ensure each participant, team and volunteer has the opportunity to progress through the School Games Levels for their chance to perform and compete for the Merseyside County Championships.

Community

To strengthen the links between school sport and community provision through community sport
